“Only The Brave” captures the human tragedies, sacrifices and stories of the Japanese American 100th/442nd Regimental Combat Team who suffered over 800 casualties to save 211 Texas soldiers of the “Lost Battalion” in what is regarded today as one of the ten most significant battles of World War II.
